
Additionally, un-named lost keys have been coming in to the Head of Year office thick and fast. If students have mislaid keys could they please come and check to see if they have been handed in.








Attendance

Please find below our attendance figures for last week and the Year to date.





As we get down to the final few weeks of the academic year it is important that students stay focused and keep coming into school. There will be our annual 100% prize draw on the final day of term and alongside this, there will be year group prizes for the greatest improvers since January.

As we move towards the holidays, can I remind all parents and carers that term time holidays cannot be authorised whatever the prior attendance rate. Can I also remind you that Bracknell Forest do issue Fixed Penalty Notice fines for unauthorised absences during term time. In the last few weeks we have had a number of parental requests to approve holidays and unfortunately, this is simply not possible in all but the most extenuating of circumstances.

However, these requests are the exception and proof of our progress regarding attendance is on statistics such as 71 students are on 100% for attendance for the whole year compared to 31 at this time in 2017 and Persistent Absence has fallen from 14% to 11%. Thank so much for your parental support on this issue during this year. It has made a big difference to the school and the students.



It has been another busy week for the PE department with a number of rounders, athletics and cricket fixtures.

Year 8 - Edgbarrow Athletics

There were unfortunately a few last minute drop outs from the Year 8 Squad and we took 6 Students to Edgbarrow for an event consisting of 8 events. Ellie and Becky from Year 7 stepped up to support the team and take part and both did a fantastic job, as did the whole team. Out of 5 schools each fielding teams with significantly larger teams than our 6 the 3 boys and 3 girls competed and behaved superbly and represented the school very well. 
