We have special Bag2School bags to put your unwanted items in (available from main reception) or you can just use a normal bin liner. Please ensure that your bags are not overfilled and are tied firmly to prevent water ingress as wet items will not be accepted by the collectors.

We have 2 big red bins for you to deposit your bags in at any time and they are located either

side of our blue entrance tunnel from Coningsby.

Bag2School is one of the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 2001 it has now paid out over £36 million.

As well as raising vitally needed funds for our school, it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. A recent DEFRA report has shown that textile collection schemes are helping to reduce the volume of textiles discarded as municipal solid waste. However it is a fact that as a nation we still send 350,000 tonnes of textiles to landfill every year.

By getting involved in our Bag2School collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles in the bag provided – this can include adults' and children's clothes, shoes (tied together please), hats, belts, handbags and soft toys. In addition to raising much needed funds it will also raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.

If you fill the donation bag and still have more then you can use any other bag to donate your items and don't forget to ask grandparents, friends and neighbours to have a sort out as well!

Many thanks indeed for helping us with this unique fundraising opportunity. Since we started our clothes collections we have raised over £1600 for the school which is fantastic.



CCF Skills at Arms Week

Brakenhale's Combined Cadet Force (CCF) set off on their biggest challenge to date as they undertook a week away at Pirbright Army Training Centre to complete their weapons handling test and fire the L98A2 Cadet GP rifle.

The week started off with hands-on lessons with the rifle in a classroom setting as the cadets learnt how to operate the basic mechanisms and how to handle the rifle both with and without a magazine. For nearly all our cadets this was their first time handling a firearm which was very daunting for some but they pushed through. This was coupled with field craft lessons which helped build upon their previous knowledge and provide new hints and tips when out in the field. After a hearty dinner the cadets were introduced to their second weapon they would be firing that week which was the BSA Scorpion Air Rifle.





Day two was just as intense as cadets learnt the basic firing procedures and positions. A long day of rifle lessons and revision clearly took its told as we saw some very tired faces at the dinner tables but this did not put students off as they persevered and clearly gained confidence in their handling of the weapon and their rifle drills. After dinner another session with the Scorpion was had with all cadets passing their weapons handling test for that rifle.

Day three covered the final lessons, which included cadets understanding how the rifle worked. After lunch tensions grew as all cadets took on their weapons handling tests; a test to show that each cadet knows how to safely control the rifle and use it in the correct way. The majority of cadets had a resounding success by passing first time and the few who did not showed great resilience by getting straight back in the room for a retest to pass second time round.





Our final day at Pirbright involved shooting the L98A2 rifle on a 100m range, Scorpion Air Rifle shooting, Archery and Marksmanship principles. The abysmal weather conditions which included sideways rain and bitterly cold wind did not diminish spirits as all cadets had a fantastic morning of activities and finished the day with huge smiles. Our final challenge involved a competition shoot which saw our very own Conor Pringle achieve the highest possible score of 20/20 targets hit at 100m. Overall, this week was a huge challenge for the cadets and staff but one that was ultimately rewarding and will be taking Brakenhale's CCF to new heights!

Should you have any questions or wish to discuss any issues that may be preventing regular attendance or causing lateness, please do not hesitate to contact me.


Attendance is never easy to push forwards as a school, we often have to have difficult conversations and parents understandably can be defensive. As a parent myself I do know that sometimes children get ill and some absence is inevitable but as a fellow parent can I urge you to do everything you can to ensure your son/daughter gets into school as often as possible. Sometimes that will mean making yourself unpopular with your children, sometimes that will mean asking for help from the school but it is so absolutely worth it. Research confirms a strong link between good attendance and good results and students who are continually around 90% attendance will always struggle to completely understand lessons because they miss one lesson every two weeks. It builds up; 20 days a year, 100 days across 5 years. How can you expect a student to get a great grade when they have been missing so many key lessons? High attendance is also a great habit for life-reliability, positivity and resilience are just the skills that so many employers are looking for. For those students in their examination years please make 2020 a 100% year, because when it is GCSE results day they will be so pleased they did.

As you are aware, part of our commitment to student welfare is to ensure high expectations of attendance including arriving to school on time.

Punctuality

Punctuality is a vital life skill and as you are aware failure to arrive on time would not be tolerated in the workplace, so we ask that you work with us to help the students improve their punctuality.

With this in mind, we have decided to change our system for late arrivals to school. If a student is late to school without a good reason they will be staying for 30 minutes after school.



A schoolcomms message will be sent notifying you that your child will be staying until 3.35pm on that same day.

Year 11 students will continue to have their detention at lunchtime, as they attend period 6 after school.

Can I take this opportunity to remind you of our school attendance procedures. If your child is unable to attend school, you should contact the school before 8.30am on every day that they are absent from school, by submitting an explanation on School Gateway, email to attendance@brakenhale.co.uk or call 01344 465050 and leave a message stating the reason for their absence.
