Dear Parents/Carers

This has been in many ways a difficult week for me and I would like to say a huge thank you to so many of you who have taken the time to contact me directly with some lovely feedback. The decision to move on from Brakenhale, as I said in the communication on Monday, was an incredibly difficult one but I do know that the school is in a very strong place and can only get even better!

The week has been very much focused for students in Year 11 and Year 13 on their incredibly important assessments. The outcome of these will play an important part in the grades that are sent to the exam boards. I have been extremely impressed with the way in which students have approached this week and I have no doubt that they are going to do exceptionally well, despite the difficult circumstances of the past year.

Lower down the school, we held the Junior Maths challenge for our Year 7 and Year 8 students which went exceedingly well and we are awaiting the results with fingers crossed. PC Ian Gregory has been in to talk to students in Year 9 about the dangers of knife crime and these sessions will be continuing with other year groups across the coming weeks. The Army Engagement Programme has returned for a group of Year 9 students focusing on core skills of survival. It really is lovely to be able to begin to open up the school again to those who are able to come in and support our community.

Continuing on the theme of community support we have been chosen by the local authority as a pilot school to work alongside the NHS in providing a placement for two specialist emotional support workers. Adrian John and Rachel Duffy joined us on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> April and they will now be based with us weekly and begin their work with our students.

Student success continues with Harry and Molly Penn who have both been accepted onto the University of Oxford UNIQ programme which is aimed at giving UK students the opportunity to experience Oxford.

## Break and Lunch Time Facilities for Students

After the Bank Holiday weekend, we are delighted to share that students will be able to access a wider range of facilities during social times - whilst maintaining social distancing bubbles. A full rota, for both weeks, will be shared with all students on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> May, it will outline the use of:

- Tennis court area, lunchtimes ONLY - MUST wear trainers
- MUGA pitches, lunchtimes ONLY - MUST wear trainers
- Traversing wall, breaks and lunchtimes
- NEW Outdoor Table tennis tables, break and lunchtimes (also available before and after school)

Students are asked to bring their own footballs, or basketballs for these areas; they are also asked to bring their own table tennis bats and balls - these are readily available for a very reasonable cost at many outlets (ie: Sports Direct - approximately £5.99 for two bats and balls). We do have a number of bats available to purchase through ParentPay and more details of these will be shared via a School Communication when the tables have been installed. We will also be selling table tennis balls, both at a very good price. The bats will be on a first come, first served basis.

The table tennis tables are due to be installed next week (weather permitting) - students will be told when they are available for use.



Finally, in order to ensure all of these facilities are looked after, treated correctly and last for a considerable length of time - students will be expected to follow some rules when using the equipment. These will also be shared next week.

We believe that this will further support all of our students to settle back into school life, providing them with a physical and mental wellbeing outlet during social times. We very much look forward to seeing all facilities used properly and with positive engagement.

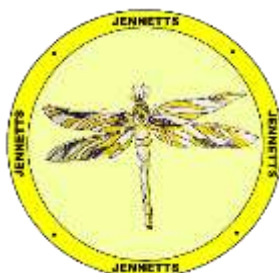
## House Points this Week

We have been so impressed with the entries received for the Royal Academy Young Artist Summer Show competition. As you can see there have been a range of different pieces that have been submitted from all through the school.

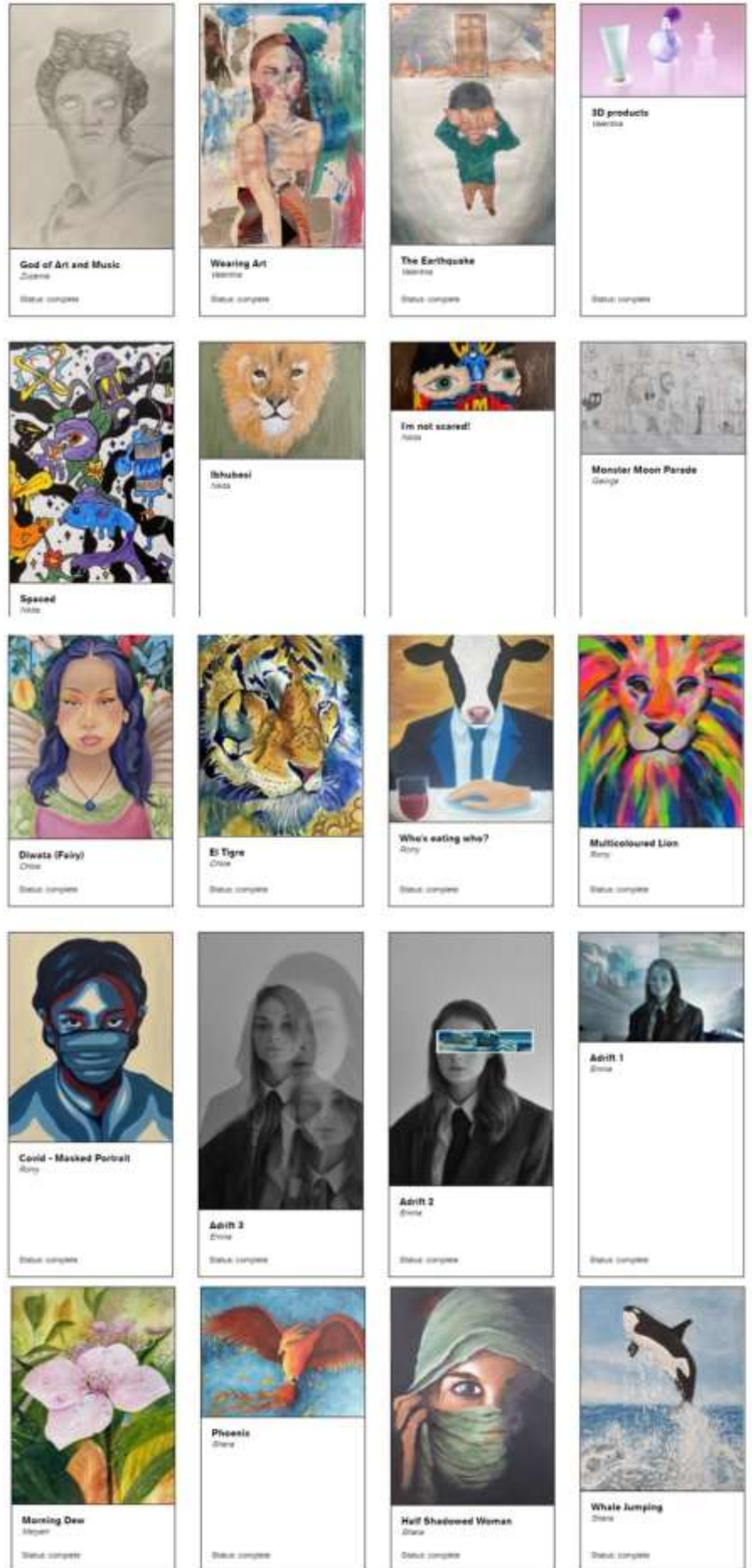

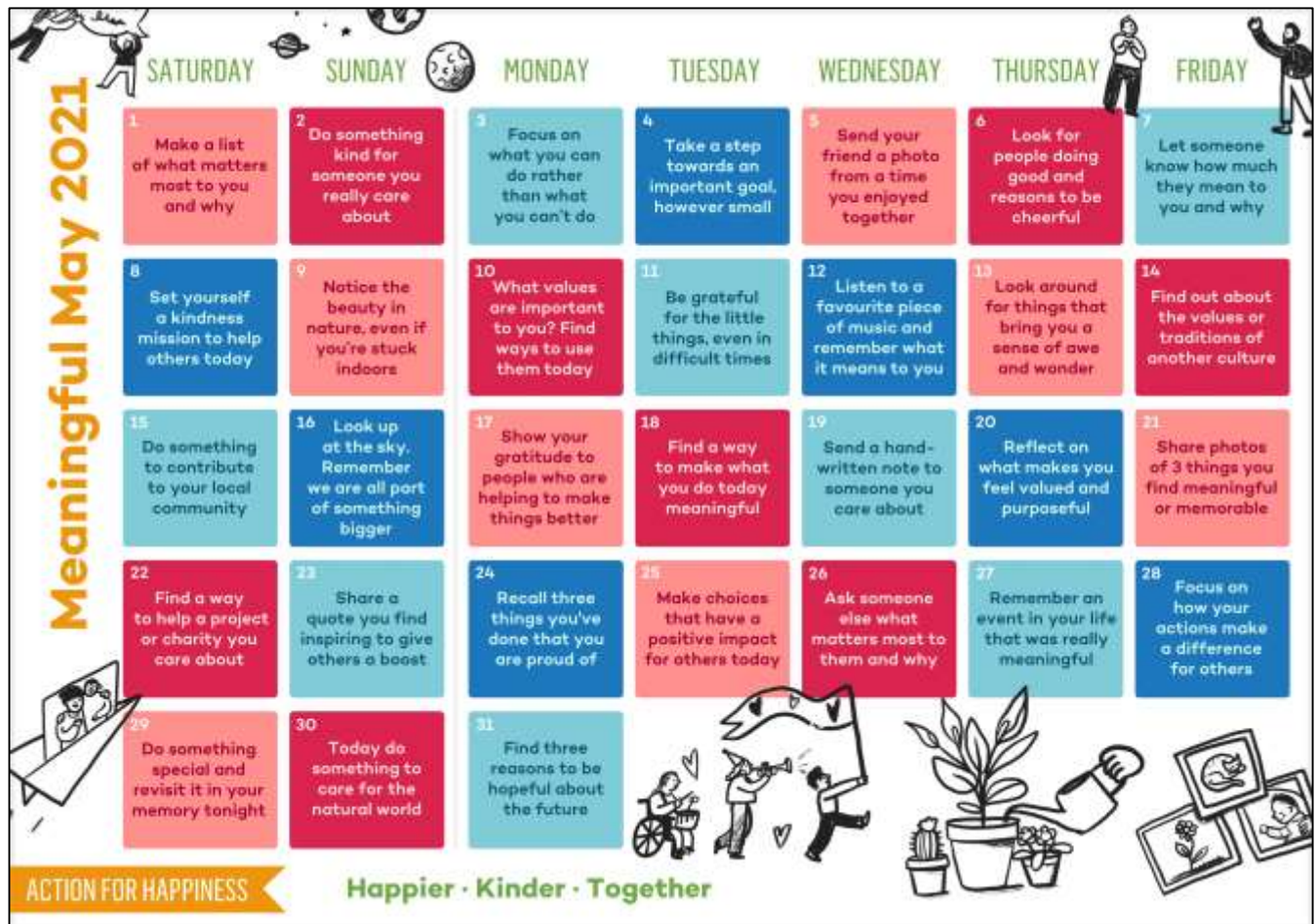
### Active April 2021
